
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
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Other important commentary from the Nov 20th Meeting

- Once the composition of each body has been determined and formally adopted the members will begin the task of reviewing and defining mission and roles.
- Need to consider the self-assessment component of the planning councils and of the larger framework. Need to routinely reflect on the effectiveness of each council and the larger infrastructure and make changes where necessary to improve.
- Attendance and involvement of council members is crucial to building an effective planning system. Need to consider how the council can encourage and empower members to remain fully engaged in the process both as council member and as a representative to their constituencies.
