350.1 CARDIO DANCE I (1.00) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: This course focuses on conditioning while using dance steps. We are expanding our dance curriculum to fit the needs of our dance students, and offer more learning opportunities to students in our new building. This class is a selective requirement for our Dance AA Degree.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.

<u>Description</u>: Beginning level steps, stretches, and toning exercises choreographed to Latin, hip hop, jazz, ballet, modern, popular, and contemporary dance rhythms. Designed to increase cardiovascular health while learning dance movements in a non-competitive environment.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

350.2 CARDIO DANCE II (1.00) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: This course focuses on conditioning while using dance steps. We are expanding our dance curriculum to fit the needs of our dance students, and offer more learning opportunities to students in our new building. This class is a selective requirement for our Dance AA Degree.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS AND JUSTIFICATIONS

HUMAN SERVICES

121 SOCIAL WORK AND HUMAN SERVICES SEMINAR (1.00) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: The State C-ID system has updated HMSV 300 Field Experience to be divided into two required corequisite courses: HMSV 121 Social Work and Human Services Seminar (1 unit), and HMSV 122 Social Work & Human Services Fieldwork (2 units). The two courses are core requirements of both the ADT in Human Services and a newly proposed Certificate of Achievement.

Corequisite: Concurrent enrollment in HMSV 122

Prerequisite: HMSV 100

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ENGL 100.

<u>Description</u>: This course provides the student who is participating in a supervised field experience in a community organization, agency, or institution with a weekly class meeting that provides the academic element to the experiential course offering. The application of concepts gained in the prerequisite or corequisite course to the field experience are be emphasized. This course is designed to provide the student with an opportunity to develop skills that would facilitate gaining employment in the human services field.

Classification: AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; Certificate of Achievement; CSU transferable.

122 SOCIAL WORK AND HUMAN SERVICES FIELDWORK (2.00) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: The State C-ID system has updated HMSV 300 Field Experience to be divided into two required corequisite courses: HMSV 121 Social Work and Human Services Seminar (1 unit), and HMSV

122 Social Work & Human Services Fieldwork (2 units). The two courses are core requirements of both the ADT in Human Services and a newly proposed Certificate of Achievement.

Corequisite: Concurrent enrollment in HMSV 121

Prerequisite: HMSV 100

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ENGL 100.

<u>Description</u>: This course offers the student a supervised field experience in a community organization, agency, or institution, allowing the student to apply knowledge and learn new skills outside of the classroom environment. This course is designed to provide the student with an opportunity to observe, practice, and develop skills that would facilitate gaining employment in the human services field.

Classification: AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; Certificate of Achievement; CSU transferable.

INTERIOR DESIGN

301 PORTFOLIO DEVELOPMENT (1.00) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: This new course provides students with a capstone experience that allows them to show the design skills acquired through their formal training in this program. It is a common professional practice to put together a portfolio in approaching the job market. The course is a requirement for various certificates in the Interior Design program, and its need is supported by the Advisory Committee and faculty members. Students strongly advocated for the addition of this course as well.

Prerequisite: INTD 128, 175 and 360 or 361

Recommended Preparation: None.

<u>Description</u>: Portfolio Development is the culminating course for students earning certificates of achievement and associate of arts degrees in Interior Design. Emphasis is placed on selecting several pieces of original work to build a professionally presented digital portfolio. This includes floor plans and elevations, computer-aided design (CAD) drawings, 3D computer designs, lighting plans, perspective sketches, and hand renderings.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate of Achievement; CSU transferable.

KINESIOLOGY, ATHLETICS AND DANCE: AQUATICS

135.1 AQUA EXERCISE I (1.00) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: Aqua Exercise I is the first of four courses examining and practicing the skills needed to use exercise in a pool as a safe, fun and effective option of physical activity to maintain good health and overall fitness. Students are able to apply this course towards an AA Degree in Kinesiology.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.

<u>Description</u>: A beginning level cardiovascular and resistance training class conducted in a low-impact aquatic environment. Instruction includes exercises designed to improve cardiovascular endurance, muscular strength, and flexibility. Students need not be competent swimmers to participate in class.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

160 WOMEN'S VARSITY SWIMMING (3.00) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: As of 2022, Cañada College in conjunction with SMCCD operates an aquatic center, including a competition pool. The request for both a women's intercollegiate varsity team and an adjunct teaching position is documented in the KAD division program review. The addition of Women's Varsity Swimming brings the Cañada College athletic department into Title IX compliance. The course fulfills the activity requirement for the local AA degree.

Prerequisite: Demonstrated ability. Student-athletes must be enrolled in 12 units.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.

<u>Description</u>: Consists of Intercollegiate Women's Swimming competition in the Coast Conference. The team also participates in regional invitationals, the Northern California Championship, and the CCCAA State Championship. Employs advanced training including conditioning and swim stroke mechanics at an intercollegiate level. May be repeated for credit up to 3 times.

EDUCATION AND HUMAN DEVELOPMENT: EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

255 MULTILINGUAL LEARNERS: LANGUAGE AND LITERACY DEVELOPMENT (1.00) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: In response to community needs regarding young children who are dual language learners, the Education and Human Development department is partnering with the San Mateo County of Education to create a Multilingual Learner Teacher Certificate of Achievement. This certificate equips early educators with the skills and knowledge specific to supporting dual/multilingual language learners during the early childhood years. ECE. 255, is one of the required courses of the program.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ENGL 100.

<u>Description</u>: Children's language and literacy acquisition focusing on the connection between language and brain development. Course covers the expressive and receptive functions of language; theories of language acquisition; first and second language acquisition; code-switching; dual language learning support; varieties of English such as Black English Vernacular; and the revitalization of tribal languages.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate of Achievement; CSU transferable.

271 FOUNDATIONAL CONCEPTS IN MULTILINGUAL LEARNING (1.00) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: In response to the growing need for educators to possess skills and knowledge in creating equitable learning experiences for dual/multilingual young children, this course updates terms, concepts, and practices to reflect current professional methods and priorities. ECE. 271 is part of the Multilingual Learner Teacher Certificate (MLTC) developed in collaboration with the San Mateo County of Education.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: None.

<u>Description</u>: The course surveys current dual/multi language learning research and practice, foundational concepts in dual/multilingual learning, and teaching strategies that promote cognitive-linguistic competence in young children.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate of Achievement; CSU transferable.

273 MULTILINGUAL LEARNERS: PERSONALIZED ORAL LANGUAGE LEARNING (POLL) (1.00) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: In response to educator needs for specific pedagogical training that supports young children who are bilingual/multilingual, this course includes general updates from the profession that includes current research, applications, and refined verbiage that reflect sociopolitical priorities. The course is developed in partnership with the San Mateo County of Education, and addresses the evolving needs in our communities (children, families, educators). ECE. 273 is part of the Multilingual Learner Teacher Certificate (MLTC).

Prerequisite: ECE. 271 or equivalent.

Recommended Preparation: None.

<u>Description</u>: This course reviews instructional methods that support learning and development of children's home language and literacy skills as well as English. Students study effective oral language strategies such as modifications, adaptations, enhancements in the environment, and teaching methods that ensure full access and active participation of all learners.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate of Achievement; CSU transferable.

280 CULTURAL HUMILITY: CULTIVATING AN EQUITY MINDSET (1.00) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: In response to community needs regarding young children who are dual language learners, the Education and Human Development department is partnering with the San Mateo County of Education to create a Multilingual Learner Teacher Certificate of Achievement (MLTC). This certificate equips early educators with the skills and knowledge specific to supporting dual/multilingual learners during the early childhood years. ECE. 280, is one of the required courses for the MLTC certificate of achievement.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ENGL 100.

<u>Description</u>: The course examines the impact of values, beliefs, implicit and explicit biases on teacher interactions with culturally and linguistically diverse children and families. Concepts such as cultural humility, anti-bias, and reciprocal communication are discussed from an equity-mindset framework necessary to create quality learning environments for all children.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate of Achievement; CSU transferable.

364 MULTILINGUAL PRACTICES IN ACTION (1.00) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: In response to community needs regarding young children who are dual language learners, the EHD program is partnering with the San Mateo County of Education to create a Multilingual Learner Teacher Certificate of Achievement (MLTC). This certificate equips early educators with skills and knowledge specific to supporting dual/multilingual learners during the early childhood years. ECE. 364 is one of the required courses for the MLTC.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ENGL 100.

<u>Description</u>: Foundational knowledge and skills for supporting multilingual learners and their families. Students use case studies to design and implement research-based language and literacy practices to promote equitable learning opportunities for all children including those with special needs.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate of Achievement; CSU transferable.

MATHEMATICS

145 LIBERAL ARTS MATHEMATICS (3.00) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: This course is replacing MATH 140 which was previously banked, and is equivalent to MATH 145 from College of San Mateo. It is being added in order to provide an alternative transfer course for students, and help us meet the requirements of AB 705. The course is a selective requirement for the Pathways to Student Success Certificate of Achievement.

Prerequisite: Completion of Intermediate Algebra or equivalent, or placement by appropriate assessment.

Recommended Preparation: None.

<u>Description</u>: This course is designed for majors with no specific math requirement. The goal is to develop in students an appreciation for the beauty and utility of mathematics. Topics include logic, problem solving, probability, statistics, geometry, mathematics of finance, systems of numeration, mathematical modeling, and computers.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.
