## PROPOSED CURRICULAR ADDITIONS - CAÑADA COLLEGE

## COURSE DESCRIPTIONS AND JUSTIFICATIONS

## ACCOUNTING

181 TAXATION OF INDIVIDUALS USING TAX SOFTWARE (4.0) (day or evening)
Justification: As competition for accounting positions in the Silicon Valley increases, students are required to have a broader base of accounting knowledge. ACTG 181 is a selective requirement for the Entry Level bookkeeper and Accounting Certificates of Achievement as well as the Accounting Associate in Science Degree.

Prerequisite: None.
Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400. Eligibility for MATH 110 or 111.

Description: Preparation of Federal and California income tax returns for individuals using tax software and manually. Topics include income tax law, theory, and practice, and preparation of Form 1040 (Individual), Schedules A (Itemized Deductions), B (Interest and Dividends), C (Profit and Loss from a Business), D (Capital Gains and Losses), and tax credits. This course is part of the Enrolled Agent Exam Preparation Series and the CPA Exam Preparation Series [CPE Hours: CPA 60].

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate of Achievement; CSU transferable.

## BUSINESS

## 672 COOPERATIVE EDUCATION: INTERNSHIP (1.0-3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: This course is being added in order to replace COOP 672 which is being deleted in order to be in compliance with the Title 5, Work Experience repeatability guidelines. BUS. 672 is a selective requirement of the Management Certificate of Achievement.

Prerequisite: A minimum of 12 completed units in the occupational discipline.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.
Description: Earn college credit for learning or improving skills or knowledge on the job. Internship is "discipline specific" in that students' job and learning objectives relate to the work experience course. Students can earn up to 3 units per semester (for a total of 16). There are no classroom meetings after the initial orientation which is offered the first three weeks of each semester. Units are degree applicable and transferable and are awarded upon achievement of approved learning objectives. Each unit requires 60 hours per unit for unpaid work during the semester. The internship must be supervised by a job supervisor and an appropriate faculty member for the chosen occupational discipline.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate of Achievement; CSU transferable.

## EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION/CHILD DEVELOPMENT

## 680CI ACTIVITY AND CURRICULUM PLANNING FOR HOME BASED CARE (3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: This course is a companion course to ECE. 384 Principles and Practices of Home Based Child Care. It is being offered under a contract with the Child Care Coordinating Council as a part of a training for Home Based Child Care Providers.

## Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.
Description: This course focuses on planning activities and curriculum for home-based child care settings. It is designed for those already caring for children in their homes and for those considering this as an option in the child care profession.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

## COURSE DESCRIPTIONS AND JUSTIFICATIONS

## ART

## 116 THE ART OF GREAT BRITAIN (3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: This course is a selective requirement for the new Art History Certificate of Achievement. ART 116, The Art of Great Britain adds coverage of an important aspect of European art history. Great Britain is one of the richest sources of world art, and the foundation of western culture.

Prerequisite: None.
Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.
Description: A cultural and historic survey of British art and architecture from Prehistory to the 19th century. Topics include megalithic structures of the Stone Age, Celtic and Roman Britain, medieval monasteries and manuscripts, castles, cathedrals, Shakespeare's England, historic houses, the Enlightenment, the English landscape movement, Jane Austen’s England, the Golden Age of British painting, and Romanticism.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate of Achievement; CSU transferable.

## MATHEMATICS

680CA FAST TRACK TO CALCULUS (6.0) (day or evening)
Justification: This course is part of our ongoing effort to accelerate students through the math sequence successfully, particularly for students who need to take engineering calculus. This accelerated class is equivalent to our trigonometry and pre-calculus courses and allows students to complete two semesters of math in one semester.

Prerequisite: MATH 120, or MATH 123 or appropriate score on the District math placement test and other measures as appropriate.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.
Description: Equivalent to MATH 130 and 222. This accelerated course combines the topics of Trigonometry and Pre-Calculus and is designed to fulfill the requirements of both courses in a single course. Topics include a study of functions, function families, their properties and transformations, compositions, inverses and combinations, complex numbers, and vectors. Function families include linear, trigonometric, logarithmic, exponential, polynomial, power, and rational. Multiple representations of functions are emphasized.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

## COURSE DESCRIPTIONS AND JUSTIFICATIONS

## DIGITAL ART AND ANIMATION

416 DRAWING FOR ANIMATION (3.0) (day or evening)
Justification: Students who have drawing skills are better equipped to enter and be successful in the animation field. Even basic drawing skills give students an advantage over others without those skills. Course fills a need in the curriculum for students to become conversant and comfortable with the creation and use of drawn graphics, and develop skills that will serve them in other classes in the curriculum, such as Principles of Animation, Storyboard Development, and Flash I. Skills developed in this class will be applicable in all other areas in the MART department, such as 3D animation and photography.

Prerequisite: None.
Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400; ECE. 201 and 260.

Description: Techniques and concepts of drawing for animation. Topics include 2- and 3-point perspective, anatomy (human, animal, and comparative), gesture, quick sketch, and sequential drawing. Emphasis on capturing movement and pose using line.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.

## EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION/CHILD DEVELOPMENT

263 CURRICULUM AND STRATEGIES FOR CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS (3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: This course is being added to the Cañada Early Childhood Education program so that we can align with the Curriculum Alignment Project expansion, and so that students taking the Special Needs specialization have an application class (263) that compliments their theory class (260).

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400; ECE. 201 and 260.

Description: Focuses on practical applications of best practices in Early Childhood Special Education. Topics covered include curriculum modification strategies to facilitate the development of cognitive, motor, social, emotional and language skills in young children with special needs (preschool, transitional kindergarten, and kindergarten age). Specific course foci include developing positive behavior management plans, collaborative teaching, integrative lesson planning that embed intervention strategies across routines and activities in both inclusive and self-contained classrooms, and methods for working with and parents of young children with special needs.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

## INTERIOR DESIGN

## 272 KITCHEN AND BATH DESIGN (3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: This new course is part of the Kitchen and Bath Certificate of Achievement, accredited by the National Kitchen and Bath Association (NKBA), and is replacing the existing INTD 270, Kitchen Design, and INTD 271, Bath Design courses. This change is being made due to low enrollments in the last few semesters and the need to better serve our students. The new course combines two topics (kitchen and bath) into one single class with the goal of increasing efficiency, time saving as well as certificate completion and retention without compromising course content, quality of education, and requirements to maintain the standards set by NKBA. The Advisory Committee is reviewing all our courses to suggest appropriate changes.

## Prerequisite: ARCH 110 and INTD 175.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.
Description: Overview of the basic principles of kitchen and bath design and space layout, including drawing floor plans and elevations to scale using hand drafting and/or Computer-aided Design (CAD) software. Selection and evaluation of current product and materials are made based on client survey. Cabinetry, appliances, finish materials, barrier free design, and changing family patterns as applicable to today's kitchens and baths are covered.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.
357 KITCHEN AND BATH SYSTEMS (3.0) (day or evening)
Justification: This course is being added in order to streamline the Kitchen and Bath Certificate, and better serve the students' needs. INTD 357 is part of the major requirements of the Kitchen and Bath Design Certificate of Achievement.

Prerequisite: INTD 272, 276 AND 360.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.

Description: Overview of the household systems that support kitchen and bath design such as: plumbing, HVAC, and lighting. Codes and Title 24 related to building systems are reviewed. Drawings include typical installation details specifying current products and systems based on code and green building initiatives.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.
367 3D MODELING SKETCHUP FOR INTERIOR DESIGNERS (3.0) (day or evening)
Justification: This new course is part of the Interior Design Certificate of Achievement and Associate in Science Degree, and the Kitchen and Bath Certificate of Achievement. The current demand in the industry is high as has been pointed out by potential employers. This new course will provide students with the necessary skills to produce drawings that show 3D models of structures, interiors, and construction details for residential and commercial spaces.

Prerequisite: INTD 360.
Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.
Description: Learn how to produce a set of drawings that show 3D models of structures, interiors, and construction details for residential and commercial spaces. Portfolio preparation is included.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.
3682020 FOR DESIGNERS (1.0) (day or evening)
Justification: This course prepares students with the computer skills needed for success in a competitive market with high demand for kitchen and bath designers. It is also suitable for industry professionals that need to brush up their CAD (Computer Aided Drafting) skills. The main application of this software is to plan for kitchen and bathroom cabinetry.

## Prerequisite: INTD 360.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.
Description: Overview of the 2020 Design Software tools and techniques for planning and visualizing kitchens and bathrooms. 3D renderings including the use of catalogs from manufacturers to select cuttingedge features, hardware, and appliances. Emphasis is on designing kitchens and bathrooms based on new or existing plans and following NKBA (National Kitchen \& Bath Association) and industry standards.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.

## SPANISH

## 145 SPANISH CONVERSATION THROUGH FILM (3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: A conversation course is listed as an option for the TMC in Spanish. Students at the intermediate college level of Spanish often need additional practice and development of oral/aural abilities in preparation for more advanced courses in Spanish. This course will count as a selective for the Spanish AA Degree. It will also be added to the Spanish AA-T sometime in the near future.

Prerequisite: SPAN 130 or 132.

Recommended Preparation: None.

Description: Thought-provoking films expose students to authentic Spanish language as well as the culture and history of different regions in the Spanish-speaking world. Analysis and discussion of films with the goal of improving accuracy and fluency in Spanish.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

Nutrition and Dietetics - Associate in Science Degree for Transfer - 32 units in the major area + Certified completion of the California State University General Education-Breadth pattern (CSU GE Breadth); OR the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) pattern, and other requirements for the Associate Degree for Transfer

## COURSE DESCRIPTIONS AND JUSTIFICATIONS

## ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

820 ESL FOR ECE. CURRICULUM (2.0) (day or evening)
Justification:
The Early Childhood Education/English as a Second Language career pathway includes 4 Spanishlanguage Early Childhood Education courses that are linked to English as a Second Language courses. Three other ESL courses have been approved and offered. This is the fourth and last course to complete the pathway.

Corequisite: Concurrent enrollment in ECE. 211 Courses are linked for language support purposes only.
Prerequisite: None.
Recommended Preparation: ESL 822.
Description: Academic language support for ESL students taking ECE. 211, Early Childhood Education Curriculum in Spanish; Development of vocabulary, oral communication, reading, and writing skills in preparation for taking English-only ECE. courses.

Classification: Not degree applicable; not transferable.

## ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

## 130 SUSTAINABLE LAND MANAGEMENT (4.0) (day or evening)

Justification: Although there is great interest in the concept of sustainability in the student body, and at the administration/faculty level, there are no classes in Sustainable Land Management offered at any of California Community Colleges. San Mateo County has a number of innovative organizations and agencies, as well as private companies currently practicing Sustainable land Management in the County. One goal of this class is to build a network of partnerships with companies, government agencies, and
non-governmental organizations to allow the students to actively see the diversity of options for implementing sustainable management practices locally. This course is a selective requirement of the Biological Sciences AS Degree Program.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400; Eligibility for MATH 110 or 111.

Description: Investigates the application of biological principles of population biology, ecosystem processes, and natural resource conservation, to sustainable land management systems in San Mateo County. Partnerships with local businesses and agencies allows students the opportunity to observe the implementation of sustainable management practices in fisheries, forestry, agriculture, and development. Students learn how to estimate a population size, analyze soil fertility, learn to interpret GIS data, and evaluate the economic viability of land management practices.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

## KINESIOLOGY - TEAM SPORTS

148.1 INDOOR SOCCER I (1.0) (day or evening)

Justification: This course is equivalent to, and replacing TEAM 148 - Indoor Soccer. This change is needed in order to comply with new Title 5 repetition guidelines. TEAM 148.1 is part of the Indoor Soccer activity family which also includes TEAM 148.2, 148.3 and 148.4 (Indoor Soccer II, III and IV). TEAM 148.1 will be a core requirement for the following degrees and/or certificates of achievement: AA and AA-T in Kinesiology degrees, and University Transfer Option 1: CSU General Education Certificate of Achievement.

Prerequisite: None.
Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400;
Description: A course designed to provide instruction and practice at a beginning level in the fundamentals of indoor soccer and Futsal, team competition, specialized tactics and beginning systems of play. Discussion of historical perspectives and social significance of indoor soccer and Futsal. Testing program in skills and laws of the game.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; Certificate; CSU transferable.
148.2 INDOOR SOCCER II (1.0) (day or evening)

Justification: TEAM 148.2 is part of the Indoor Soccer activity family which also includes TEAM 148.1, 148.3 and 148.4 (Indoor Soccer I, III and IV). TEAM 148.2 will be a core requirement for the following degrees and/or certificates of achievement: AA and AA-T in Kinesiology degrees, and University Transfer Option 1: CSU General Education Certificate of Achievement.

Prerequisite: TEAM 148.1
Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400;

Description: Continuation of TEAM 148.1. Provides the intermediate student the opportunity to refine and perfect the basic indoor soccer skills essential to team play. Topics include indoor soccer and Futsal, team competition, specialized tactics and beginning systems of play. Discussion of historical perspectives and social significance of indoor soccer and Futsal. Testing program in skills and laws of the game.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; Certificate; CSU transferable.
148.3 INDOOR SOCCER III (1.0) (day or evening)

Justification: TEAM 148.3 is part of the Indoor Soccer activity family which also includes TEAM 148.1, 148.2 and 148.4 (Indoor Soccer I, II and IV). TEAM 148.3 will be a core requirement for the following degrees and/or certificates of achievement: AA and AA-T in Kinesiology degrees, and University Transfer Option 1: CSU General Education Certificate of Achievement.

Prerequisite: TEAM 148.2
Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400;
Description: Continuation of TEAM 148.2. Provides the intermediate student the opportunity to refine and perfect the indoor soccer skills essential to team play. Topics include indoor soccer and Futsal, team competition, specialized tactics, and systems of play. Discussion of historical perspectives and social significance of indoor soccer and Futsal.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; Certificate; CSU transferable.
148.4 INDOOR SOCCER IV (1.0) (day or evening)

Justification: TEAM 148.4 is part of the Indoor Soccer activity family which also includes TEAM 148.1, 148.2 and 148.3 (Indoor Soccer I, II and III). TEAM 148.4 will be a core requirement for the following degrees and/or certificates of achievement: AA and AA-T in Kinesiology degrees, and University Transfer Option 1: CSU General Education Certificate of Achievement.

## Prerequisite: TEAM 148.3

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400;
Description: Continuation of TEAM 148.3. Provides the expert student the opportunity to perfect the indoor soccer skills essential for team play. Topics include indoor soccer and Futsal, team competition, specialized tactics, and systems of play. Discussion of historical perspectives and social significance of indoor soccer and Futsal.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; Certificate; CSU transferable.
184 SOCCER: SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND CONDITIONING (2.0) (day or evening)
Justification: This new course provides better off season soccer preparation of our student-athletes for the fall intercollegiate season.

Prerequisite: None.
Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400;

Description: Focuses on mastering individual skills and team concepts. It is designed to improve the individual technique of students wishing to play intercollegiate community college soccer. Students also participate in numerous competitive drills and soccer conditioning. Demonstrated ability is required. May be repeated for credit up to three times.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; Certificate; CSU transferable.
187 TENNIS: SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND CONDITIONING (2.0) (day or evening)
Justification: This course will serve as the non-traditional (out of season) course for our new Women's Varsity Tennis team.

Prerequisite: None.
Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400;
Description: Focuses on mastering individual skills and doubles team concepts. It is designed to improve the individual techniques of students wishing to play intercollegiate community college tennis. Students also participate in numerous competitive drills and tennis conditioning. Demonstrated ability is required. May be repeated for credit up to three times.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; Certificate; CSU transferable.

## ART

118 THE ART AND ARCHITECTURE OF SPAIN (3.0) (day or evening)
Justification: Art 118 is part of a series of courses on the great art centers of the world. It joins courses on England, France and Italy. This course is needed for the Art History Certificate. This course adds coverage of an important aspect of European art history. Spain is one of the richest sources of world art, and the foundation of western culture. Two courses on Italy, two courses on France, one course on England, this course on Spain, and one course on Flanders and Holland are planned. These courses are designed to co-ordinate with the collections of museums in the Bay Area, to take advantage of field trips and special exhibitions.

Prerequisite: None.
Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.
Description: A cultural and historic survey of Spanish art and architecture from Prehistory to the 21st century. Topics include Prehistoric Spanish cave paintings, Roman Spain, Hispanic-Visigothic art, Medieval Spain, Islamic Spain, the Spanish Empire and El Greco, the Golden Age of Spanish painting, the Enlightenment and Goya, Picasso, and modern architecture in Spain.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.
213 LIFE DRAWING II (3.0) (day or evening)
Justification: For the art, design, and/or animation student interested in depicting the human figure, it is necessary to continue learning figure drawing throughout the period of their studies. This course would allow students to develop their life drawing skills for a second semester and build upon the skill and knowledge learned in the introductory course. ART 213 is a selective requirement of the AA degree in Studio Arts.

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Prerequisite: ART 207.
Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.
Description: Continued study of the human form as art using the techniques and materials of drawing in graphite, charcoal, pastel, ink, and mixed media. Application of more advanced studies of anatomy and expressive representations of the human figure in different environments. Studio practice drawing from live models.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

## MUSIC

470.1 CHOIR I (1.0) (day or evening)

Justification: MUS. 470.1 is a selective major requirement for the current AA degree in Music. Large ensemble performance experience is required for an AA-T Music degree, which is in development; this would also support a summer chorus opportunity for the community.

Prerequisite: None.
Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400; MUS. 100 or equivalent.

Description: Performance of choral music for accompanied and/or unaccompanied choir at the beginning level. The choir may perform alone or in conjunction with other musical organizations on and off campus. Performance is required.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

## EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION/CHILD DEVELOPMENT

680CJ TEACHING PHONOLOGICAL AWARENESS SKILLS TO YOUNG CHILDREN (1.0) (day or evening)

Justification: Students will learn about the current national reading research that shows the importance of learning how to teach phonological awareness content to preschool children. The research points out that teaching phonological awareness is a precursor to phonemic awareness and phonics taught in kindergarten and on. This content for children is needed as a developmental sequence before they reach third grade. This course is being created in collaboration with the San Mateo County Office of Education. This course is a post certificate/degree course which provides ongoing continuing education/training for teachers/directors working in the early learning and education workforce.

Prerequisite: None.
Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.
Description: Students learn how to guide preschool children's understanding of phonological awareness. The teacher's role in guiding children's learning of phonological awareness including understanding the sounds and words they are beginning to hear and explore is covered.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS AND JUSTIFICATIONS

## EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION/CHILD DEVELOPMENT

680CK TEACHING EARLY MATH ACTIVITIES TO YOUNG CHILDREN (1.0) (day or evening)
Justification: This course in being created as a result of feedback from the ECE./CD Advisory Committee and in collaboration with the San Mateo County Office of Education.

Prerequisite: None.
Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ENGL 100.
Description: The teacher's role in planning activities and strategies which promote early learning math concepts for preschool children in Early Childhood Education settings is explored.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

## MATHEMATICS

225 FAST TRACK TO CALCULUS (6.0) (day or evening)
Justification: This course is part of our ongoing effort to accelerate students through the math sequence successfully, particularly for students who need to take engineering calculus. This accelerated class is equivalent to our trigonometry and pre-calculus courses and allows students to complete two semesters of math in one semester. It is a selective major requirement for the following programs: Geography AA Degree Program, Interdisciplinary Studies with Emphasis in Natural Science and Mathematics AA Degree Program, and the Math for Surveying and Computer-Aided Design Certificate of Achievement.

Prerequisite: MATH 120, or MATH 123 or appropriate score on the District math placement test and other measures as appropriate.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.
Description: Equivalent to MATH 130 and 222. This accelerated course combines the topics of Trigonometry and Pre-Calculus and is designed to fulfill the requirements of both courses in a single course. Topics include a study of functions, function families, their properties and transformations, compositions, inverses and combinations, complex numbers, and vectors. Function families include linear, trigonometric, logarithmic, exponential, polynomial, power, and rational. Multiple representations of functions are emphasized.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.
