3.0 Agenda

Ray Hernandez made a motion to approve the agenda, Martin Partlan, seconded the motion: all approved.

4.0 Minutes

Ray Hernandez made a motion to approve the 4-12-10 minutes with these changes:

Data from Rob Johnstone, Skyline College, "All in all, plus / minus grades were given in 1,053 sections, or 38% of the total sections in Fall 2009.

- ➤ The ratio of sections giving plus / minus grades was extremely consistent at the three colleges 39% at Cañada & Skyline, 36% at CSM
- ➤ Overall, 51% of instructors used plus / minus in at least one section (Skyline 55%, Cañada 50%, CSM 49%)
- ➤ Overall, 29,550 of the 72,807 grades (41%) were given in a section where at least one plus or minus was given.
- ➤ In sections where plus / minus grades were given, the overall GPA using letter-only would have been 2.69, and using plus-minus, it was 2.67. Note that these are not student GPAs but are based on the sum total of the grade points given for each course enrollment."

6.2 Min Quals & FSA's Documents

All three college senates have reviewed the documents and have comments for revisions. The administration at Skyline stated that they did not have sufficient time to review at this time, but they do want to respond.

Harry Joel addressed the need for revisions and thanked the Senate for beginning the process. He recommended that we look at the opening language about reduction in force and suggested that we talk about the constructive use of FSA in assigning teaching roles.

Additionally he asked about the assignments of secondary FSAs by administrative functions rather than by a faculty committee.
