In fall, want to add 180 courses (across whole district); spring, add 300 – summer 2017, completely migrated to Canvas. July 1 2017, web access gone. DE deans will determine which courses for spring 17 migration. Support: Canvas support is only after hours (aft 5 PM). District solution is to use our current team to support Canvas during the day, then Canvas team in evening. After a while, students will comment on which support team they prefer. State does not pay for daytime support of Canvas. If the Canvas support is preferred, district will pay for daytime support from Canvas.
