ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION NO. 24-25 ELECTING TO ADOPT PART-TIME FACULTY BENEFITS UNDER SECTION 22807.5 OF THE PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' MEDICAL AND HOSPITAL CARE ACT WITH RESPECT TO A RECOGNIZED EMPLOYEE ORGANIZATION

On June 21, 2024, the District and the AFT signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to establish a health insurance program for the period between July 1, 2024, through December 31, 2026, pending confirmation with CalPERS and the State Chancellor's Office. Since the MOU was signed, ongoing discussions with CalPERS have clarified that our District is eligible to create the Adjunct Faculty Group under the Public Employees Medical and Hospital Act (PEMHCA) Government Code 22807.5.

Pursuant to PEMHCA Government Code 22807.5, a contracting agency that is a community college district must file a *Part-Time Faculty resolution* to extend health eligibility to part-time faculty employees who have an appointment of at least one semester and whose teaching assignment with one or more community college districts equals or exceeds two courses or 40 percent of the cumulative equivalent of a minimum full-time teaching assignment, who are otherwise ineligible.

Staff recommends that the Board approve the following resolution to adopt PEMHCA Government Code 22807.5 as a provision attached to the Adjunct Faculty Group.

• Resolution 24-25: Adjunct Faculty Group - GC Section 22807.5

The adoption will be activated by CalPERS effective November 1, 2024, pursuant to the receipt of these resolutions and CalPERS implementation procedures.

APPROVAL TO EXECUTE CELL SITE USE PERMIT WITH NEW CINGULAR WIRELESS PCS, LLC – SKYLINE COLLEGE

In recent years, the Board has authorized the District to execute a series of agreements with wireless communication companies for installation of radio equipment at various District sites. Recently, New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC approached the District with a request to install and operate its cellular communications equipment at Skyline College. After review of the equipment proposal, the District negotiated a favorable agreement with New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC.

New Cingular Wireless will use approximately three hundred eighty-eight (388) square feet of land beside the Facilities Maintenance Center for placement of the communications equipment. The permit calls for a one-time administrative fee of \$3,000 and an annual payment to the District of \$63,654, with an annual three percent (3%) increase throughout the period of the permit. The period would be for five (5) years with an option to renew for three (3) successive five (5)-year renewal terms.

In July 2021, the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges amended the regulations governing Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) programs to require more robust and accountable programs. Districts are now tasked with annual reporting of EEO-related activities in order to receive EEO funds appropriated by the Legislature.

California Code of Regulations, Title 5, Section 53024.2 sets forth the categories of information that must be reported as part of this annual certification. Districts must certify that they have:

- 1. recorded, reviewed, and reported the data required regarding qualified applicant pools and longitudinal data;
- 2. reviewed and updated, as needed, the Strategies Component of the district's EEO Plan;
- 3. investigated and appropriately responded to formal harassment or discrimination complaints filed pursuant to the process found beginning at Section 59300 of title 5 of the California Code of Regulations; and
- 4. expended Equal Employment Opportunity funds in accordance with the purposes set forth in subdivision (c) of section 53030.

This review is an annual process that districts must complete every year. This form combines the reporting of all items listed in Section 53024.2 into a single document, expressly subsuming and replacing the EEO Fund District Expenditure Report and the Multiple Method Allocation Certification Forms used in past years.

Our District has supported participating in and attending the National Conference on Race and Ethnicity (NCORE) Conference through our District Antiracism Council (ARC) since 2022. CONSIDERATION OF FINANCIAL PARTNERSHIP WITH JOBTRAIN

JobTrain is a 501(c)3 nonprofit educational and training institution accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. JobTrain's programs combine vocational training, academics, and essential skills development, preparing students to turn their lives around—from unemployment and poverty to success and self-sufficiency. Strong partnerships with employers ensure that students receive the training they need for employment so that businesses can find motivated workers who are well trained for their jobs. Since 1965, JobTrain has been adapting to meet current employment needs. Since its inception, more than 190,000 low-income individuals and their families have benefited from JobTrain's programs.

The missions of District and JobTrain are closely aligned with a focus on improving access, increasing enrollment, and offering transformational learning programs to students of San Mateo County. The District also has a long history of partnering with JobTrain. JobTrain currently provides educational space to Cañada College.

JobTrain is currently located in Menlo Park and is in the process of developing a new facility in East Palo Alto that encompasses 50,000 sq ft. The new Center for Economic Mobility is the embodiment of JobTrain's strategic direction, to help low-income people achieve lifetime economic mobility, supporting them until they reach economic independence. The new facility will enable JobTrain to build a modern workforce development center, increase training facilities, host key economic mobility partners, like Cañada, and administering our growing regional footprint with expanded administrative staffing and much more.

JobTrain has raised \$33 million for its new facility and is exploring funding options for an additional \$6 million to cover the total project cost of \$39 million.

Staff seeks Board direction in exploring possible ways the District can partner with JobTrain. Possible options identified by Staff include leasing space in the new facility with a possible advance payment, a direct loan to JobTrain, and a possible lease-leaseback arrangement where the District invests in leasehold improvements and leases them back to JobTrain. Staff is working with County Counsel to determine allowable arrangements.
