APPROVAL TO REJECT BID AND REBID DISTRICT-WIDE ADA SIGNAGE PROJECT

During the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Transition Plan conducted in 2020, the survey identified that several signs on all three campuses do not meet ADA requirements to maintain accessible spaces. The general scope of work for the project includes:

· Furnishing all labor, materials, equipment, and overhead for removal, fabrication, and installation of

signs and re-locating of existing signs to meet ADA requirements and the current California Building Code. Include patch and painting for signs that are relocated, if needed.

Facilities Planning, with the assistance of General Services, advertised this construction opportunity (Bid #86888) to C-45/D-42 (signage), or B licensed general contractors through the District's online bid portal. A formal Advertisement to Bid was published in a local newspaper for two consecutive weeks on November 7 and 15, 2022. Five (5) contractors attended the mandatory pre-bid conferences held on November 15 and 17, 2022.

On December 15, 2022, the District received one (1) bid for the project as follows:

Contractor	Total Bid
Weidner Architectural Signage / House of Signs Inc dba Weidner CA	\$530,646.74

Staff conducted its due diligence process to validate that the proposal met the project's minimum requirements and found that the cost proposal exceeded the project budget target for construction costs by 44%. Therefore, staff recommends the Board to reject the bid. Staff also recommends to re-bid the project to foster more competition. Staff will conduct a review of the project budget and will revise the project documents as required.

RATIFICATION OF FACILITIES USE AGREEMENT WITH THE SAN MATEO COUNTY UNION COMMUNITY ALLIANCE FOR COLLEGE OF SAN MATEO

In November 2022, the San Mateo County Union Community Alliance (SMCUCA) entered into an agreement with the College of San Mateo regarding the use of the college's facilities to provide certificated, Apprenticeship-Readiniess Training courses for the Trade Introduction Program (TIP). This agreement aims to enhance the quality of life for all workers and their families in San Mateo County through programs and partnerships designed to support quality jobs, ensure community health, and create shared economic prosperity.

Senator Josh Becker (13th CA Senate District) introduced Senate Bill 893 (<u>SB 893</u>), co-authored by Assembly members Kevin Mullin and Marc Berman, on behalf of the San Mateo County Community College District (SMCCCD) on January 31, 2022. SB 893 worked its way through the legislative process and was passed by the State Senate (with amendments from committees) and Assembly (with amendments from committees) and was approved by the Governor on September 30, 2022.

The Board of Trustees adopted a set of interim policies for the Spring 2023 semester at its regular meeting on September 8, 2022. These policies focused on utilizing the authority of SB 893 to pay for student fees, including enrollment fees and others associated with registration in course sections. As the District prepares a set of permanent policies working through its participatory governance processes, there is interest in providing additional support to students in the Spring 2023 semester. This report provides information and a recommendation to the Board to adopt an additional interim policy for the Spring 2023 semester that would provide monthly transportation support for students.

ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION NO. 23-01 IN SUPPORT FOR DISTRICT WIDE STUDENT HOUSING GRANT APPLICATION

As part of the 2021-22 California Budget package, the Legislature passed Senate Bill 169 in 2021, providing funding for grants to public colleges and universities to develop affordable student housing. This program provides California Community Colleges the opportunity to apply for student housing grants over a three-year period with three rounds of grant awards. In 2022, AB 183 transferred the administration of the Affordable Student Housing Grant Program from the California Department of Finance (DOF) to the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO).

On October 26, 2022 (Board Report No.12.1), the Board was provided an update on the Student Housing Grant Application. In the first round of grant applications submitted in October 2021, the District was awarded a \$200,000 planning grant and the California Department of Finance further determined that the District's proposal was ineligible for construction grant funding.

The District is reapplying for construction funding in the second round (due January 25, 2023) for inclusion in the 2023-24 State Budget and the third round (due July 3, 2023) for inclusion in the 2024-25 State Budget. The CCCCO has required each District to adopt a Board Resolution in support of the Affordable Student Housing Grant Application.

CELL SIGNAL DISTRICTWIDE

With the increased use of devices & dropping of 3G signals, we have heard from faculty, staff & students about the lack of cell signal on our campuses. Skyline campus, in particular, has had the most complaints about dropping cell phone calls or the ability to make outgoing calls or receive or send texts. Discussions with Campus Cabinets confirm that the cellular signal strength throughout our campuses is inadequate in many locations.

College leadership had asked ITS to provide a DAS (Distributed Antenna System) solution as a district-wide project to address cell coverage. To provide an overall robust solution, there was a need to conduct a signal survey for all spaces throughout the District.

SMCCD engaged with Wireless Metrix (https://www.wireless-metrix.com/) to perform a comprehensive site survey to understand the signal strength issue. Wireless Metrix develops and supplies equipment for optimizing and benchmarking 3G, 4G, and 5G networks. Typically working with cellular carriers for network transmission analysis and verification, Wireless Metrix helped SMCCD ITS produce a detailed analysis of cellular coverage at Skyline, CAN, and CSM campuses. The information that was gathered from these cellular signal surveys will help SMCCD ITS establish a system design and outline overall cable/power infrastructure and backup power, as well as DAS system devices such as wireless access points, network distribution switches, as well as core systems which will be tied to the three major carrier networks. Likewise, the graphical output of the survey will also serve as a scope of work for proper coverage of the selected DAS Integrator.

Wireless Matrix completed the site survey in December, evaluating LTE (4G) and 5G cellular signal coverages. The survey report is attached to this Board information report. We aim to use these survey results to begin the system and infrastructure design and prepare for an RFP/RFQ unless we can find a piggybackable contract.
