COURSE DESCRIPTIONS AND JUSTIFICATIONS

DEVELOPMENTAL LEARNING SKILLS

822 <u>STUDY SMART SKILLS</u> (1.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: Educational Assistance Classes (EACs) are a special type of class designated in Title V. We are currently the only college in the area that does not offer any EACs as part of our Disability Resource Center (DRC) program. These classes will supplement DRC accommodations to support students with disabilities to be successful in their courses at Cañada College.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Open Curriculum.

<u>Description</u>: This course is designed to assist students to obtain study skills and develop learning strategies to reach their educational objectives. Topics include strategies to improve mathematics, reading, writing, and studying skills for students.

<u>Classification</u>: Not degree applicable; not transferable.

827 <u>ASSISTIVE COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY: SMARTPEN</u> (0.5) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: Educational Assistance Classes (EACs) are a special type of class designated in Title V. We are currently the only college in the area that does not offer any EACs as part of our Disability Resource Center (DRC) program. These classes will supplement DRC accommodations to support students with disabilities to be successful in their courses at Cañada College.

Prerequisite: None.

February 22, 2017

Recommended Preparation: Open Curriculum.

<u>Description</u>: This course provides an in-depth instruction about the various features of the Smartpen and ways to apply notetaking strategies when using the Smartpen. Students learn to transfer recorded notes from the Smartpen to the computer-based software and how to review and organize notes in this software.

Classification: Not degree applicable; not transferable.

829 ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY - TEXT-TO-SPEECH PROGRAM (0.5) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: Educational Assistance Classes (EACs) are a special type of class designated in Title V. We are currently the only college in the area that does not offer any EACs as part of our Disability Resource Center (DRC) program. These classes will supplement DRC accommodations to support students with disabilities to be successful in their courses at Cañada College.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Open Curriculum.

<u>Description</u>: This course provides training in a text-to-speech program, to support students' learning styles and/or physical needs in the area of reading and studying their textbooks. Students learn how to use this assistive technology tool as an accommodation for reading and studying electronic versions of their textbooks and completing tests/exams from concurrent subject area classes. No previous computer experience is required.

Classification: Not degree applicable; not transferable.

DIGITAL ART AND ANIMATION

385 <u>CODING FOR DESIGNERS AND ARTISTS</u> (3.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: Many of today's technology sector jobs call for a combined set of skills, which include both visual design and writing scripts and code. Today's job marketplace calls for individuals who can not only create visuals such as 3D characters, and designs like web sites, but also know the basics of using scripting languages to allow those visuals to behave interactively. This course provides an introduction to coding concepts through hands-on visual learning that art and design students gravitate toward. Students will use existing and widely-available coding languages (both general-purpose and application-specific) such as JavaScript and ActionScript. Advisory board members consistently comment on the growing need for artists and designers to be at least knowledgeable about scripting concepts and the ability to write simple scripts to speed up workflow.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.

<u>Description</u>: Introduction to writing scripts and code for artists and designers. Using JavaScript and ActionScript, students learn the fundamentals of coding by creating interactive animated graphics. Activities include drawing graphics, controlling animation, working with sound, and interacting with user

inputs. Coding concepts covered include working with variables and arrays, writing functions, working with loops and logic, creating classes and objects, and translating between different coding languages.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION/CHILD DEVELOPMENT

275 CHILDREN'S LANGUAGE AND LITERACY DEVELOPMENT (3.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: Due to increasing demands on the Early Childhood Education (ECE.) teaching workforce, we are revising the ECE. Literacy Specialization available for students wanting to apply for a Master Teacher Permit issued by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing. This course, joined with ECE. 191 offers a depth of understanding about language, literacy and the use of literacy within the early care and education classroom for children birth through early elementary school. Banking ECE 192 gives us the opportunity to pair this literacy course with the literature course.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ENGL 100.

<u>Description</u>: Explores the process of children's language acquisition, emotional development, and literacy development. Highlights the teacher's role in promoting creativity and self-expression through verbal and symbolic language.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.

369 <u>REFLECTIVE TEACHING SEMINAR</u> (3.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: Research shows that teacher's ability to reflect on their teaching is an important aspect of a high quality educational environment, yet teachers struggle with how to incorporate reflection into their daily practice. This course is designed for Early Childhood Education teachers who have completed their ECE 366 Practicum and are working in early childhood environment or are certificated teachers working in transitional kindergarten settings. It is a part of the Early Childhood Leadership Specialization and the Transitional Kindergarten Teacher Certificate.

<u>Prerequisite:</u> ECE. 201, and ECE. 211 or 263; and ECE. 333 and 366, or completion of an equivalent student teaching experience in an accredited elementary teaching credential program.

Recommended Preparation: None.

<u>Description</u>: This course is designed for teachers working in early childhood or transitional kindergarten settings. Students examine their teaching philosophy and multiple roles in the classroom including teacher, parent educator, and mentor. Throughout the course students engage in the reflective practice cycle as the primary methodology for growth. Students use a variety of instructional strategies, including purposeful play, to assess, document and describe children's learning and development.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.

HUMAN SERVICES

680CA COUNSELING SURVIVORS OF TRAUMA (1.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: The type of violent crimes that this course examines are on the rise in American society. Although there is some attention paid to serving survivors in the Human Services core courses, the seriousness and frequency of these crimes demands more specific training for Human Services workers and students who plan a career in the field.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.

<u>Description</u>: Introductory course covers methods of treating survivors of domestic violence and also addresses other types of violence and trauma such as child and elder abuse and hate crimes. Designed for professionals and paraprofessionals in Human Services positions and students preparing for a career in Human Services.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

HUMANITIES

650 <u>STUDY ABROAD LIFE AND CULTURE, A HUMANITIES PERSPECTIVE</u> (3.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: This course is part of the study abroad program. It is designed to be taught by the study abroad faculty attending with the district. The course is designed to be broad enough that it can be taught by any humanities faculty who are hired to teach the study abroad program for the course, whether it be in England, Italy, or Spain. If the instructor comes from a discipline within humanities, they will offer this course to provide the cultural component of the course.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ENGL 100.

<u>Description</u>: Explore the cultural elements, including literature, art, art history, drama, music and theater and philosophical movements of a foreign country as part of the Study Abroad Program. Students gain skills in cross-cultural competency as well as specific knowledge and understanding about the host country as they attend lectures, interact with local experts, participate in field trips and take part in cultural events. Students must be enrolled in the Semester Abroad Program.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

KINESIOLOGY, ATHLETICS AND DANCE – KINESIOLOGY

138 STUDENT ATHLETE SKILLS FOR SUCCESS, SECOND YEAR (1.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: This course builds on the creation of KINE 137 - Student Athlete Skills for Success, First Year, and allows us to better address the specific needs of student athletes in their second year of

competition. KINE 138 speaks to the transfer athlete preparing him/her to transfer and compete at a four year institution.

Prerequisite: KINE 137.

Recommended Preparation: None.

<u>Description</u>: Designed for the second year student athletes with an emphasis on athletic and academic transfer requirements. This course aids in further exploration of the common challenges of students participating in competitive collegiate sports during their second year of competition; including student athlete schedule management, teacher-player communication, Leadership, and athletic transfer requirements in congruence with California Community College Athletic Association, National Association Intercollegiate Athletics, and National Collegiate Athletics Association bylaws and guidelines. Student athletes participate in athletic planning, and academic monitoring. Note: This course is not activity-based and is not applicable to the specific area requirement in Physical Education for the Associate Degree.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

NEURODIAGNOSTIC TECHNOLOGY (NDT)

Last year, the college was approached by UCSF because of their workforce needs in the area of Neurodiagnostic Technology. There are currently only 2 training programs for Neurodiagnostic Technology on the west coast, at Bellevue College in Bellevue, WA and at Orange Coast College in Costa Mesa, CA. Labor market data provided by UCSF supports the need for a technologist training program in Northern California, and in the Bay Area in particular. We consulted with the President's Cabinet, the Division of Science and Technology, and the Instructional Planning Council, and then worked with Director of Workforce Development Alex Kramer to incorporate the new program into the Strong Workforce Program grant.

The new department code (NDT) will be used to create courses which will be part of an AS degree in Neurodiagnostic Technology.

<u>Justification</u>: Cañada College is an integral part of the SMCCD Study Abroad program and this course is the cornerstone of the Study Abroad experience. This new course has been developed with support from, and in collaboration with, Skyline, College of San Mateo, and the District's Special International Programs office.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ENGL 100.

<u>Description</u>: This course introduces students to the daily life, history, economy, politics, social structures and culture of a foreign country as part of the Study Abroad Program. Students gain skills in cross-cultural competency as well as specific knowledge and understanding of a wide range of topics in the social sciences as they attend lectures, interact with local experts, and participate in field trips and hands-on activities. Students must be accepted into the Semester Abroad Program.

COMPUTER BUSINESS OFFICE TECHNOLOGY

432 INTRODUCTION TO COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (3.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: This course is a combination of two existing courses (CBOT 430 and 431). The intention is to replace two one and a half unit courses with one three unit course with several benefits: provide a seamless experience for students for a set of classes we would like them to take together, and allow for more synergy across topics because all students will have covered all topics. The course is part of many degrees and certificates as part of their major requirements.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.

<u>Description</u>: Introduction to key skills and concepts of file management, word processing, spreadsheets, database management and presentation software. Learn to navigate Windows, manage files and folders, create and format documents, create and format spreadsheets, use basic functions and formulas, design and build simple databases to organize information, and integrate files between applications.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.

KINESIOLOGY, ATHLETICS AND DANCE - DANCE

115.1 MEXICAN FOLKLORIC DANCE I (1.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: This course is being added in order to expand our dance offerings and serve our community better. The course is part of the Kinesiology AA and AA-T degrees as a selective requirement.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.

<u>Description</u>: Beginning level of the cultural dances of México. Students learn the skills of dance while improving their technique, poise, self- confidence and creative ability as well as deepening their understanding of and appreciation for the rich and colorful heritage that each dance represents.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; Certificate; CSU transferable.

115.2 MEXICAN FOLKLORIC DANCE II (1.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: This course is being added in order to expand our dance offerings and serve our community better. The course is part of the Kinesiology AA and AA-T degrees as a selective requirement.

Prerequisite: DANC 115.1.

Recommended Preparation: None.

<u>Description</u>: Continuation of DANC 115.1 Covers the Intermediate level of the cultural dances of México. Students learn the skills of dance while improving their technique, poise, self- confidence and creative ability as well as deepening their understanding of and appreciation for the rich and colorful heritage that each dance represents.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; Certificate; CSU transferable.

115.3 MEXICAN FOLKLORIC DANCE III (1.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: This course is being added in order to expand our dance offerings and serve our community better. The course is part of the Kinesiology AA and AA-T degrees as a selective requirement.

Prerequisite: DANC 115.2.

Recommended Preparation: None.

<u>Description</u>: Continuation of DANC 115.2. Covers the Intermediate to advanced level of the cultural dances of México. Students learn the skills of dance while improving their technique, poise, self-confidence and creative ability as well as deepening their understanding of and appreciation for the rich and colorful heritage that each dance represents.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; Certificate; CSU transferable.

115.4 MEXICAN FOLKLORIC DANCE IV (1.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: This course is being added in order to expand our dance offerings and serve our community better. The course is part of the Kinesiology AA and AA-T degrees as a selective requirement.

Prerequisite: DANC 115.3.

Recommended Preparation: None.

<u>Description</u>: Continuation of DANC 115.3. Covers the Advanced level of the cultural dances of México. Students learn the skills of dance while improving their technique, poise, self- confidence and creative ability as well as deepening their understanding of and appreciation for the rich and colorful heritage that each dance represents.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; Certificate; CSU transferable.

MUSIC

275 HISTORY OF JAZZ (3.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: Jazz is an important part of American culture and is crucial to any well-rounded music department's offerings. There is student interest in jazz and African-American history. This course will be a selective requirement of the existing Music AA Degree. It also supports opportunities to create learning communities in our class offerings.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ENGL 100.

<u>Description</u>: Understanding and enjoying music by studying the historical development of jazz from a musical and sociological perspective. Topics include discussion of musical elements, vocal and instrumental ensembles, artistic values, and the role of jazz in our culture.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

PHILOSOPHY

175 MODERN PHILOSOPHY (3.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: We are reactivating this course for the AA-T in philosophy, and submitting it for C-ID approval (C-ID PHIL 140).

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ENGL 100.

<u>Description</u>: This course addresses 16th through 18th century philosophy with emphasis on the broad epistemological and metaphysical developments of empiricism and rationalism in philosophical thought from Descartes to Kant. Special topics include the foundation of knowledge, the nature of the human mind, free will, and the foundation of morality.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; CSU transferable.

312 INTRODUCTION TO PHILOSOPHY OF RELIGION (3.0) (day or evening)

<u>Justification</u>: This course is being added in place of PHIL 320 which was banked a few years ago. It is part of the major requirements of the AA in Philosophy and being submitted for C-ID approval and CSU

GE articulation. The course will be added to the AA-T in Philosophy once CSU GE articulation is approved.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ENGL 100.

<u>Description</u>: An introduction to philosophical thinking about religion, with an emphasis on issues central to traditional monotheism. This course teaches how to critically examine arguments concerning the origin of religion, the existence of God, the historicity of miracles, the veridicality of religious and mystical experience, the existence of spirits or souls, the possibility of life after death, the equal validity of all religions, and other topics.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.
