COURSE DESCRIPTIONS AND JUSTIFICATIONS

BUSINESS

158 STARTUP AND FREELANCE FUNDAMENTALS (3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: This course has been offered successfully in the fall of 2016 as an experimental course. Due to demand across disciplines, it is being converted to a permanent course. BUS. 158 is part of the core or selective requirements of three AS Degrees and three Certificates of Achievement.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.

Description: Designed for students of various disciplines who wish to start their business or work as freelancers or independent contractors. It provides practical knowledge on how to start a business - from getting a business license to getting your first customer. Topics include: opportunity recognition, marketing, social media strategy, customer service, financing with limited resources, planning and managing a business, legal aspects, and special issues for independent contractors and freelancers.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS AND JUSTIFICATIONS

DIGITAL ART AND ANIMATION

433 ADVANCED SPECIAL EFFECTS AND COMPOSITING (1.5) (day or evening)

Justification: Continuation of the skills taught in MART 431 - Special Effects and Compositing. The techniques in these disciplines are many and varied, and require a full semester of classes in order to adequately cover the basics and expand into more advanced concepts. Created as a half-semester course (to be offered in the second half of the fall semester) so that students who have completed MART 431 can continue their studies. This course is part of the 3D Animation and Video Game Art Certificate and AA degree. Advisory board members are consulted regularly in order to keep instructional materials current with industry needs and expectations.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400; MART 431 or equivalent experience.

Description: Continuation of the techniques presented in MART 431. Advanced techniques for the creation of special effects for film and video. Combining 2D video and animated footage with 3D footage created in commercial 3D animation software. Creating and compositing special effects through particle generation and rendering. Optimizing and outputting final footage for use in video, film, and gaming.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.

EDUCATION AND HUMAN DEVELOPMENT - EDUCATION265 POSITIVE BEHAVIOR IN INCLUSIVE SETTINGS (3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: The Education and Human Development program is expanding its course offerings to meet the needs of adults working with school-age children in a variety of settings (i.e., after school and recreational programs, academic enrichment and homework assistance, general classroom support). This class provides knowledge and application of basic Behavior Management techniques appropriate for school-age children and older.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.

Description: This course reviews positive behavior support strategies for adults working with both typically and atypically developing children. Children's behaviors are analyzed from a developmentally appropriate and culturally sensitive framework that honors individual differences in children, as well as the complexity of their behaviors and communicative intents. Through the use of functional analysis and positive behavior support plans, students in the course explore strategies used to effectively manage challenging behaviors in school-age children.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.

FASHION DESIGN AND MERCHANDISING114 TRAVEL STUDY: INTRODUCTION TO ITALIAN FASHION (3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: This course has been successfully taught the last two summers as an experimental course, and is now becoming a permanent course. FASH 114 - Travel Study: Introduction to Italian Fashion is a selective course requirement in four of our current programs (Two AS degrees and two certificates of achievement).

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for READ 836 and ENGL 836; or ENGL 847 or ESL 400.

Description: An introduction to the Italian Fashion Industry from pre-World War II to the present day. Students analyze designers, fabrics, and manufacturing techniques and the implications for global fashion. The study of fashion as a form of Italian art through lectures, field trips, and guest speakers.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.

INTERIOR DESIGN361 CHIEF ARCHITECT FOR INTERIOR DESIGNERS (3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: This new course is part of the Interior Design and the Kitchen and Bath Certificates of Achievement, as well as the Associate in Science Degree in Interior Design. The course provides students with a contemporary software tool that enables designing in both 2D and 3D efficiently following the guidelines of building codes. The Advisory Committee for the Interior Design Program

acknowledges that this package is becoming an industry standard, especially for Kitchen and Bath. In order to better serve our students, this new course provides them with the necessary skills to produce drawings that show 3D models of structures, interiors, and construction details for residential spaces. This skill increases student's marketability.

Prerequisite: ARCH 110.

Recommended Preparation: None.

Description: Chief Architect software creates 3D architectural home design including kitchen and bath. The software produces floor plans, elevations, and construction documents quickly and efficiently. Drawings follow industry standards and techniques. Design tools for photo-realistic renderings and virtual tours are explored.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate; CSU transferable.

KINESIOLOGY, ATHLETICS AND DANCE – TEAM SPORTS

132.3 FLAG FOOTBALL III (1.0) (day or evening)

Justification: Cañada College currently offers TEAM 132.1 and 132.2. This is the third course in the family and will allow for students to continue their development of flag football skills. TEAM 132.3 is part of the Kinesiology AA and AA-T Degrees.

Prerequisite: TEAM 132.2.

Recommended Preparation: None.

Description: Continuation of TEAM 132.2. This course provides advanced intermediate skills in flag football, including catching, running with the ball, strategies, blocking, and rules of the game. Drills and competitions are used.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; CSU transferable.

SOCIOLOGY

325 HONORS COLLOQUIUM: SOCIOLOGY OF HUMAN PERSONHOOD (1.0) (day or evening)

Justification: This course introduces an innovative and influential field within sociology and the philosophy of science that is currently not offered within the district but is of increasing importance to the discipline of sociology. Students will have access to some of the newest ideas and theories within sociology and better prepare them for the sociology major.

Prerequisite: ENGL 100; Completion of, or concurrent enrollment in one of the following: ANTH 110, or COMM 180, or PHIL 100, or PLSC 150, or PSYC 100, or SOCI 100.

Recommended Preparation: None.

Description: Study of human personhood as an emergent property of social life that shapes and is shaped by social structures and culture with implications for how human flourishing and failure can be

understood within the social sciences. NOTE: This section is designed primarily for students in the Honors Transfer Program, but is open to all students. All students enrolling in this section will be required to do Honors level work. Honors credit will be earned for SOCI 325 upon completion of the course. Honors credit will also be earned for the approved, completed or concurrent companion course, upon completion of both SOCI 325 and the companion course with a grade of A or B.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; CSU transferable.

COMPUTER INFORMATION SCIENCE

680CF INTRODUCTION TO RELATIONAL DATABASES (3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: Programmers need to learn how to create, populate and use data from a Relational Data Base System, which is the most pervasive system in the world today. This knowledge fully enables them to write programs. Students and Industry would like Cañada College to offer the class.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ENGL 100; CIS 118.

Description: Covers Relational database design and the use of database management systems. It covers Data Definition Language and Data Manipulation commands. It includes an introduction to the relational model, relational algebra, and SQL. The course includes relational design principles based on dependencies and normal forms. Covers normalization of data to eliminate data anomalies. Additional database topics introduced are indexes, views, transactions, authorization, integrity constraints, triggers, on-line analytical processing. Interactive and programmatic interfaces to database systems. All application programming projects use commercial database systems.

HUMAN SERVICES

300 FIELD EXPERIENCE IN SOCIAL WORK AND HUMAN SERVICES (3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: The Human Services program is revising and adding courses to more easily facilitate student transfer to university level courses in the field. This course is integral to the Human Services new Associate Degree for Transfer program which is being added.

Prerequisite: HMSV 100.

Recommended Preparation: None.

Description: This course offers supervised practicum in a community organization, agency or institution, allowing the student to apply knowledge and learn new skills outside of the classroom environment. This course is designed to provide the student with the opportunity to develop skills that would facilitate gaining employment in the social work/human services field.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; AA-T/AS-T Degree for Transfer; CSU transferable.

100 DANCE APPRECIATION (3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: This Dance Appreciation course is a needed core requirement for the Dance Associate in Arts Degree Program.

Description: An overview of dance history, beginning with classical era, folk and ethnic dance. COURSE DESCRIPTIONS AND JUSTIFICATIONS

ART

119 THE GOLDEN AGE OF PAINTING IN NORTHERN EUROPE (3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: Art 102 focuses on Renaissance and Baroque art of Italy and Spain; this new course is required to explore in depth the art of these periods in Northern Europe. It is a selective requirement for the AA Degree in Art as well as the Art Certificate of Achievement.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ENGL 100.

Description: A cultural and historical survey of the art of Burgundy, Flanders and Holland during the Golden Age of the Renaissance and Baroque eras. This exploration of the unique geographical, political, economic, religious and social environment of northern Europe in the age of discovery forms the backdrop for systems of patronage and the art market which nourished some of the greatest artists in history, including Rembrandt, Vermeer, Rubens and Breughel.

Classification: AA/AS Degree; Certificate of Achievement; CSU transferable.

MATHEMATICS

820 JUST-IN-TIME SUPPORT FOR INTERMEDIATE ALGEBRA (3.0) (day or evening)

Justification: This is course is the primary component of the MATH curriculum redesign at all three colleges in the district. The general purpose of this course is to accelerate students through the developmental math sequence. This will be done by removing most of the elementary algebra (MATH 110) courses from the schedule, and replacing them with extra MATH 120 course that is linked to this new course. The course is created for compliance with AB705.

Corequisite: Concurrent enrollment in MATH 120.

Prerequisite: None.

Recommended Preparation: None.

Description: A review of the core prerequisite skills, competencies, and concepts for intermediate algebra. Intended for students who are concurrently enrolled in MATH 120, Intermediate Algebra, at Cañada College. Review topics include: computational skills developed in pre-algebra, the vocabulary of algebra, translation from English to algebra, and evaluation of literal expressions and functions. Topics covered in more depth include: solving and graphing linear equations and inequalities in one and two variables, solving and graphing systems of equations in two variables, factoring, algebraic operations on polynomial and rational expressions, solving quadratics using factoring, and rational equations. Recommended for students with little or no recent knowledge of algebra. A graphing calculator is required for this course.

Classification: Not degree applicable; not transferable.
