She endorsed the idea that the library, which has never been the center of campus geographically or in any other way, can become more useful by working more closely with the Learning Center, which continues to be phenomenally successful and vital
- Theme leaders will keep an eye on their themes (Jacque, Rita, Gerardo, and Lezlee, but we are all responsible for making sure all of the themes are addressed.)
- I offered the metaphor of a hike, in which we can explore our beloved Learning Center/Library, DSPS and other ways that Cañada supports learning. The idea I have is that the central point of going on a hike is not to finish the hike, although that is satisfying and useful because it keeps us moving, but even more important is the hike itself, and its opportunity for exploring, observing, and enjoying.
