	Anniqua Rana will be going Thursday to an ALLIES Long Beach to attend an adult education conference and present on the work Jenny Castello has been doing. Relatedly, Jenny will presenting to a group of Silicon Valley executives to try to get more money for related projects. Linda Haley got \$90,000 from this group. Both Jenny and Anniqua will be presenting at CATESOL in April and have requested funding from professional development and basic skills.		
	REQUIREMENT THAT IS DRIVING Students OUT OF BASIC SKILLS CLASSES During the Fall 2011 semester, a new requirement was put in place that students complete 3-hour orientations in order to register. This requirement seems to have contributed to having to cancel all Level 1 ESL on campus this semester. Ps have passed out multiple authorization codes to try to make it possible for them to register. The orientations are from 9-12 and from 4-7 on campus, at a different time from placement tests. They are rethinking it in Student Services. This also may have been the reason that several 826 classes were canceled. This orientation is for brand new students; returning Ss do not have to do it. It must be done in person.		
	Because of this, the ESL department would like the Basic Skills committee to grant \$1000 for an ESL faculty to create 16 lessons the first two days of every ESL class will be orientations with different materials for the 4 different		

levels and the 2 different skills categories. This way the ESL students will be exempt from the requirement. Sheila Lau will come to the February ESL meeting; she is open to this plan. Still need administrative OK.

This is a bigger problem than just ESL; it reduced the size and number of ENGL 826 Ss as well. We need to get this changed, and in the interim, we need to make sure that all faculty know about it.

We should invite Sheila Lau, Kim Lopez, and Robin Richards to a special meeting and tell them how we feel about this and present solutions to this problem such as Online orientations, in-person orientations immediately following placement tests, one-hour orientations after placement tests and then two hours online, orientations in first two day of class. College Success students should be waived automatically

NEXT STEPS

Plan a meeting with Robin, Sheila, and Kim to discuss the orientations. Discuss scheduling to ensure students enroll in all the classes
