7.1. Basic Skills—Current Projects and Up-Coming Goals

Presenter: Carla Stoner-Brito. Basic Skills meets on the third Thursday of each month in 3-104.

Percentage of students who score into basic skills classes (in parentheses for each discipline: number of units required to reach transfer level courses when students place into the lowest level):

- 87%: Math (15 units)
- 76%: Reading , 80%: English (16 units)
- ESL (40 units)

We all share these students, they are not taking just basic skills classes.

Basic Skills Activities:

- Learning communities
- ESL class visits and collaboration with faculty
- Summer LEAP 2009/2010
- Professional development opportunities
- "Pathways to Degree and Transfer" a new certificate that acknowledges the students' progress towards moving onto transferable level courses
- Collaboration with UCSC researchers
- Building Spanish collection in the library: ECE, Lit in Spanish, Health Science, films
- Conference presentations

Initiatives in the works:

- Quick Stop Counseling: in the Library and Learning Center
- College Success Resources

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- Early alert for basic skills and ESL students
- Pilot program for accelerated English/Math
- "A Visiting Professor": a professor from the next level class tells students what the expectations will be in that class.

Basic Skills Funds:

- Tutors Learning Center
- Counselor/Coordinator
- Professional Development

7.2. Educational Master Plan

Emerging Trends in Higher Education:

- 1. Increase in on-line courses
- 2. Balance of both digital and face-to-face offerings
- 3. Demand for non-semester based courses and programs
- 4. Increasing student diversity
- 5. Increased demand for sustainability (programs and programming)
- 6. Decrease in financial aid, increase in costs
- 7. Decreased funding for public higher education

San Mateo Co:

- Diverse population with diverse educational needs
- Relatively older population
- High median income, significant income disparity
- Parents have high expectations for their students

Cañada

- 2/3 female, 1/3 male
- The older the student, the higher the GPA
- GPA variation by city of student
- 43% students take one course only
- Students taking full-time load are more likely to be more successful

Is there a cause and effect relationship between number of units and success? NO. However, the message that is being presented across the college is that there is a cause and effect relationship and that in order for our students to be successful we should make them take more units.

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ASGC members gave input on where we expect the college to be five years from now.
