Patty Hall led discussion on Discipline List Proposal: Teacher Education

Background: Movement in the state to create a new discipline within the California Community College System titled: Teacher Education. The rationale for this proposal is based on the following:

1) The expanded role of the community colleges in K-12 teacher preparation has resulted in an expansion of the education curriculum offered and articulated with CSU, UC, and California Independent Colleges and Universities.

2) The content of these teacher education courses and the articulation agreements with universities require faculty to possess expertise in K-12 teacher preparation requirements, state content standards, state teacher performance expectations, effective teaching methods and pedagogical practices, and possess experience in a K-12 setting.

3) Although a current Education discipline exists within the community colleges, the minimum qualifications are too broad, do not specify K-12 teaching experience and do not align with state and national teacher preparation program accreditation standards. A proposal to change/narrow the minimum qualifications for this existing discipline was previously rejected.

Two main concerns arise with the minimum qualifications proposed for this new discipline.

To teach courses in this discipline, Teacher Education, one must hold BOTH a master's degree AND a teaching credential. This runs counter to the intent of the Disciplines List.

<u>Objection #2</u>: The proposed minimum qualifications for the new Teacher Education discipline exclude faculty with a master's degree in early childhood education or child development.

Motion: that our senate directs the voting delegate to the Spring Plenary, to vote "no" on this proposal on behalf of the Cañada faculty. Moved/seconded/approved unanimously.

President Buckley led discussion on our accreditation site team visit

We are fast approaching our accreditation site team visit (scheduled for October 21-24). The US Department of Education, as well as the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC), requires that colleges establish student achievement benchmarks, or standards, that institutions strive to achieve. Along those lines, there is a proposal that the topic of Institutional Integrity must be embedded throughout the entire Accreditation Self Study document. For example: How does Cañada College uphold and protect its integrity while looking for areas to improve overall institutional effectiveness? How does the college follow faithful pursuit of the institutional mission, compliance with local, state, and federal laws and regulations, and responsiveness to the needs of students, faculty, staff, and other constituents? Discussion was held.
