- 3. Review of research and best practices/ "Achieving the Dream College Implementation Strategy Overview"
 - ■Data regarding student persistence was reviewed. Committee members were asked to break into groups and brainstorm ideas to improve these rates. The groups then presented their ideas to the larger committee. Ideas included:
 - -A discussion regarding enforcing pre-reqs. This would have to be a district wide conversation and implementation....making it mandatory for students to enroll in basic skills classes their first semester.
 - -Improving communication between counseling faculty and instructional faculty regarding new sections that may need to be added. Due to class availability, many students are unable to take basic skills classes their first semester. They tend to "self-enroll" in transfer level classes they are not ready for.
 - -Integrating English and Reading classes to shorten the length of time students spend in basic skills classes.
 - -Creating a list of recommended classes students can take their first semester if they are unable to enroll in the basic skills classes.
 - -We should continue to fund bridge programs such as Summer Leap. Should we hold a "Word Jam" or other similar program for Reading and Writing?
 - -Placement testing process should be reviewed...perhaps we can implement a mandatory practice session before each student takes the placement test.? Students need to understand the placement test is a high stakes exam! We should be doing more outreach to the high schools regarding this matter.
 - -We should offer late-start basic skills classes.
 - -We need to constantly review data... can we look at patterns of groups of students and learn about their persistence?
