Substantive Agenda

1) Curriculum Items:

Business, Design & Workforce

- Santos, Sarita
 - 1. ECE. 255 Multilingual Learners: Language and Literacy Development (1.00) (New Course)

Sarita Santos presented on behalf of the ECE. items. Sarita shared that she is in partnership with the Justice and Multilingual Education for the Institute of Racial Equity and Excellence as well as individuals who work in the field to create a teacher certificate for those who work with young children who are bilingual or multilingual learners. Sarita noted that they have been working on creating a 10 unit certificate that focuses on the practices, curriculum assessment, and pedagogical foundations for dual language learners and those who are multi-language learners for young children (pre-k to third grade) and the goal was to revise existing courses and create new courses. These individuals chose to work with our campus as they noticed we have an Inclusion Support Certificate. Sarita added that the focus is on topics related to language and literacy because they have to compare the language and literacy development of those who are monolingual versus those who are not. ECE. 255 focuses very specifically on multilingual language cognitive processes

2. ECE. 271 - Foundational Concepts in Multilingual Learning (1.00) (New Course)

Sarita noted that this course focuses on theoretical concepts of multi-language learning.

3. ECE. 273 - Multilingual Learners: Personalized Oral Language Learning (POLL) (1.00) (New Course)

Sarita stated that this course is a specific strategy that the San Mateo County of Education has been offering and wants to continue to offer to current ECE instructors as a professional development opportunity. Sarita noted that this is a very specific strategy one unit and the intent is to offer this to anyone who is completing the certificate who is planning to work with young children in our communities who are multilingual or dual language learners.

4. **ECE. 280 - Cultural Humility: Cultivating an Equity Mindset (1.00)** (New Course)

Sarita shared that there was discussion related to educators' character and integrity that is fostered when working effectively with children who are from diverse linguistic and cultural backgrounds, and it was agreed that cultural humility which includes understanding one's own biases is necessary for educators to be effective in the classroom. Modeling cultural humility, compassion and sensitivity as opposed to solely teaching concepts is key.

5. **ECE. 364 - Multilingual Practices in Action (1.00)** (New Course)

Sarita stated that this course is to be focused on pedagogy and methodology in classroom settings, intended to build upon other courses being offered.

6. Certificate of Achievement Multilingual Learner Teaching (New Program)

Sarita noted that this is funded by two grants with the intent to encourage existing teachers to earn a certain expertise area and/or earn a specific concentration. The previous offering seemed insufficient to address the needs of a diverse community, so ten units was established for this certificate.

Discussion— The committee discussed the rationale behind the number of units being offered. Gloria asked how this tied into the permit process and Sarita offered background on this inquiry. Danielle asked what a student will receive by completing this certificate, and Sarita offered potential examples of outcomes for students who complete this certificate. José asked Sarita to please work with Dean Lacefield on obtaining state approval so this can be in the catalog as soon as possible.

2) Science & Technology/Counseling

 - MATH 145 Liberal Arts Mathematics (3.00) (New Course)

Evan Innerst presented on behalf of this item. He shared that MATH 140, Math for General Education used to be a course which is banked. With AB705, faculty felt something similar should be brought back. This course includes writing, art, history, and other aspects in addition to calculation. This course was modeled after CSMs course, which was approved for transfer at multiple institutions and the hope is that this will be the case on our campus as well.

Motion – To approve new course MATH 145: M/S: David Monarres, Sumathi Shankar **Discussion**— Gloria thanked Evan for bringing this class back and giving students another option. She mentioned that the soonest this course will be able to be used for CSU transfer and possibly UC transfer in math will be fall 2023, if approved. Sumathi also shared her thanks to Evan for the return of this course. Sumathi asked Gloria when she felt the earliest the course should be offered. Gloria shared that as of this coming fall, it would satisfy our local degree requirement, but not a transfer. José noted that because of the schedule development, the earliest this can be offered is spring 2023, however, he agreed with Gloria that fall 2023 would be advisable so that if students take the course, they can use it not only for the requirement but also for transfer.

Gloria Darafshi presented on behalf of this item. She shared that this modification has to do with the inclusion of MATH 145 in the certificate, in addition to eliminating MATH 120 due to the uncertainty of it continuing to be offered.

Lisa noted that this action item has to do with AB 705, and having to stop teaching pre-transfer English courses. All students now place into English 100 or 105, which are transfer level courses, with ENGL 105 offering more support. Lisa noted that ENGL 836 and READ 836 are no longer being taught, and this action item has to do with deleting those references which would be misleading and confusing to students.

- Reviewed and approved some 260 updated course outlines of record with a special focus on equity—simple language and the highlighting of materials, pedagogy, and concepts that address all constituencies
- Reviewed and approved some 20 associated programs
- · Aligned grading requirements across the district
- · Determined and agreed to credit by exam scores across the district
- Aligned AA/AS pathways
- Revised and agreed to English prerequisites, pursuant to AB 705
- Established a district-wide ethnic studies requirement

- · Credit for prior learning, including for veterans
- Revision of math program to comply with AB 705
- Compliance with AB 1705, which is almost certain to pass the legislature and be signed by the governor in the fall. This may further reduce our ability to offer pre-transfer courses in English, math, and ESL.
