Enclosed is a *Supplementary Report* regarding College of San Mateo's activities since the October 2013 external evaluation team visit. I have also included supporting evidence where appropriate. In addition, the College identified a significant number of errors of fact, which were reported to the team chair. I have a particular concern regarding what I believe are several errors of fact in Standard III.C.

I received the final *External Evaluation Report* via email on December 16 and received the hard copy of the report today. As a result, I have not had the time to review the final report in detail. However, after my initial review I was disappointed to find that many of the errors of fact had not been corrected in the final report. I am concerned about many of the inaccuracies because the College's *External Evaluation Report* will become a public document after the College receives official communication from the Commission early next year.

Therefore, I am requesting the opportunity to appear before the Commission in accordance with the *Procedures for an Institutional Chief Executive Officer's Appearance Before the Commission*. Your letter dated December 12, 2013 states that I was make this request by December 13. However, I had not received this communication until December 16. I was informed by Mr. Pond that this deadline has been extended to December 19.

I am attaching the College's error of fact response that was submitted to the team chair for your reference. I will provide a more focused list of concerns once I have had the opportunity to review the final *External Evaluation Report* in detail.

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**Introduction**

The purpose of this report is to provide an update to the Commission on College actions since the October 2013 external evaluation team visit. The College has also submitted its errors of fact document to the team chair of the external evaluation team. The College has made progress on substantially all of the recommendations identified in the *External Evaluation Report*. For the sake of brevity, however, the College has opted to report on selected recommendations only.

**College Recommendation #2**

*To increase the effectiveness in meeting the Standard, the team recommends that the College immediately complete the process of assessing and evaluating its activities of the 2008-2013 planning cycle for the purpose of improving student learning and student achievement. (I.B.1, I.B.2, I.B.3, I.B.4, I.B.5, I.B.6, and I.B.7)*

**Update**

The College has completed a draft of a final assessment of its 2008-2013 planning cycle. As part of this process, the College has assessed and has closed out all of its Institutional Plans for the 2008-2013 planning cycle including its *Technology Plan* (see College Recommendation #5 below). These activities were scheduled to be completed by the end of the Fall 2013 semester in accordance with the planning cycle schedule adopted by the College. The College is on schedule with this task and has adhered to its planning cycle, which is fully documented in its *Self-Evaluation Report*. Final approval of the report by Institutional Planning and Budgeting Committee (IPBC), as well as College Council, is scheduled for March 2014. The College also noted this activity in its Actionable Improvement Plans/Planning Agenda (*Self Evaluation Report, vol 3. pg 75*).

Finally, it is important to note that the College has regularly assessed and has evaluated its planning activities and its planning processes throughout the 2008-2013 planning period. The College has developed institutional plans and initiatives, has allocated resources, and has changed its planning processes as a result of its ongoing assessment activities. College assessment activities are summarized in Table I.B-1 in the College's *Self Evaluation Report*.

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### **College Recommendation #3**

*To order to meet the Standards, the team recommends that the College complete and assess SLOs for all courses, programs, certificates and degrees, linking them to Institutional Learning Outcomes. Further, the team recommends implementing multiple modes of assessment for certificates and degrees. The College should utilize multiple modes of assessment for the Learning Centers in order to integrate academic support services with the instructional programs. (II.A.1.a,c; II.A.2.a,b,c,e,f,h,i; II.A.6; II.A.3.a; ER 10)*

#### Update

The College has discovered that a number of assessment activities had not yet been reported in TracDat at the time of the visit. TracDat is the College's centralized database that contains SLO and assessment information for the institution.

#### *Course Level SLOs and Assessment*

Significant progress has been made regarding course level SLOs since the preparation of the college's *Self-Evaluation*. Of the 660 regular courses offered during 2010-11, 2011-12, 2012-13 and Fall 2013, 50 courses are no longer in the College *Catalog* or are planned to be banked in Spring 2014. One hundred percent of the remaining 610 courses have SLOs.

The College has determined that of the 610 active courses, 89.3 percent have been assessed as of December 2013. Currently there are 65 courses with SLOs that need to be assessed. The College has developed a schedule to ensure that course-level SLOs are assessed for these courses within the next three semesters. Thus, one hundred percent of the courses reported in the College's *Self-Evaluation Report* have been assessed or are scheduled to be assessed within next three semesters.

Finally, while many programs do map course-level SLOs to Institutional Student Learning Outcomes (ISLOs), the College recognizes that this process is not systematic as it could be. As part of its ongoing review of SLOs the college has put a structure in place to ensure that course SLOs are mapped to ISLOs on a consistent basis. The College also held an SLO mapping workshop this fall.

#### *Program, Associate Degree, and Certificate Level SLOs and Assessments*

A number of program, associates, and certificate level SLOs were developed this fall as a result of recent workshops and division curriculum development efforts. These curricular changes are scheduled for Committee on Instruction (COI) approval in the Spring 2014 semester. Once approved by the COI, the College will have 92 out of 95 programs with SLOs, or 96.8 percent. The College has also reviewed programs, associate degrees, and certificates where SLOs are not yet identified. The College will work with the faculty responsible for those programs to expedite the identification and assessment of SLOs. The College expects that SLOs will be identified for all programs, associate degrees, and certificates no later than October 2014.

Program, degree and certificate assessment is not executed until the student applies for the degree or certificate. Insufficient time has passed since the writing of the *Self Evaluation* to demonstrate much change in the assessment percentage reported. It is our anticipation that as more students apply for awards, the number and percentage of programs with ongoing

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assessment of SLOs will greatly increase. At the same time, the College also issues very few degrees in certain disciplines, which makes it difficult to capture adequate data for assessment purposes. Thus, the College recognizes the need to expand its use of assessment techniques to include multiple modes of assessment and will actively work on improving assessment techniques for programs, degrees, and certificates for the remainder of the academic year.

#### *Learning Center SLOs and Assessments*

As noted in the errors of fact report provided to the team chair, the College performs multiple modes of assessment for most, but not all of its learning labs and centers. Also, because all discipline-specific learning support centers are managed directly by discipline faculty, who also perform assessment as part of program review, the College contends that academic support services are highly integrated with instructional programs. Nevertheless, the College's Learning Labs and Centers Coordinating Committee will review its current methodologies and also seek best practices to ensure that multiple modes of assessment are executed on a systematic basis for all of its learning labs and centers. The College Learning Labs and Centers Coordinating Committee discussed multiple modes of assessment at its November 2013 committee meeting and will work on this goal for the remainder of the academic year.

#### *Additional Administrative Support for SLOs and Assessment*

The College received approval from the Board of Trustees in December 2013 for a dean of academic support and learning technologies position, which will be filled this spring. Among other things, this position will be responsible for working with the faculty SLO coordinator and the Assessment Committee to provide direct administrative support and oversight of the College's SLO and assessment efforts. The College believes that this new administrative structure will greatly increase the effectiveness of the College's SLO and assessment efforts and more efficiently align resources to help the College achieve its goals with respect to SLOs and assessment.

#### **College Recommendation #5**

*In order to increase effectiveness, the team recommends the college evaluate technology planning. The evaluation process should include assessing the manner in which technology planning is documented, and assuring that technology needs in program and service areas are met effectively. (III.C.1, III.C.1.c, III.C.2)*

The College submitted an *Errors of Fact Report* to the team chair. In that report the College noted many errors of fact in Standard III C and cited numerous examples of how technology planning is evaluated, as well as the assessment activities executed by both the College and the District related to technology needs. The College believes that the team may have missed key pieces of the evidence provided in the *Self-Evaluation Report* regarding technology planning and assessment.

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A summary of the evidence, which was reported in the College's errors of fact response, is provided below:

- *Planning Processes are Evaluated at Regular Intervals*  
The College evaluates the efficacy of all of its planning processes on a regular basis. In fact, the Institutional Planning and Budgeting Committee made the decision to merge the Technology Committee and the Distance Education Committee in 2012 as a direct result of assessing its planning processes.
- *The College Technology Plan has been Assessed*  
The College has completed a full assessment of its 2008-2013 Technology Plan as part of its 2009-2013 institutional plan assessment process (see College Recommendation #2 above).
- *The College has a well-defined and fully documented process for resource allocation with respect to technology needs*  
The College's process regarding technology needs is grounded in program review and is well understood by all constituencies. The process has been in place for the last fifteen years and has been executed on a consistent basis each academic year. College Council, a participatory governance body, reviews the annual technology recommendations to ensure that the participatory governance process was followed as documented.
- *The College and the District rely on several other assessment instruments to evaluate whether technology needs in program and service areas are met effectively*  
The College provided several examples of assessment instruments to the team which are documented and supported by evidence in the errors of fact report to the team chair.
- *Program Review trends and themes are compiled and analyzed*  
As part of its planning process the Institutional Planning and Budgeting Committee compiles and analyzes a summary of program review trends and themes in order to determine the extent to which needs are met at an institutional level.
- *District ITS executed a comprehensive customer service survey*  
Districts Information Technology Services (ITS) executed a comprehensive customer service survey of all district employees in 2012 to assess the extent to which ITS is meeting the technology needs of its end users. The District has assessed this survey and has acted on many of its findings. Detailed evidence is provided in the College's errors of fact report.
- *ITS technology support/HelpCenter contacts are evaluated by an online feedback survey inviting college and district staff to assess the effectiveness of the service*

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- *Summative evaluation of technology services performed in the District Strategic Plan for Information Technology*  
The District Strategic Plan for Information Technology 2012-2016 also contains a summative evaluation of technology services. One section in particular, “Assessment of Support and Services,” summarizes findings, pp. 24-26.
- *Regular assessment of end user satisfaction surveys regarding technology*  
The College has regularly issued satisfaction surveys for students and employees to assess the level of satisfaction with College technology both for academic and administrative use.

To summarize, the College and the District have developed and have executed multiple assessment methods to assess both the efficacy of the technology planning process and the extent to which the College is meeting technology needs in its program and services areas. The College identifies technology needs both at the program planning level and at the institutional planning level. Given the evidence provided above, the College administration is puzzled by this particular recommendation and requests further clarification from the Commission so that the College can respond effectively to the recommendation.

### **Other College Developments**

#### *Administrative Positions*

The College has filled its permanent vice president of instruction position and its permanent vice president of administrative services position. Both candidates will begin their assignments on January 2, 2014. As noted above, the college has received authorization from the Board of Trustees to create a dean of academic support and learning technologies position. The position will be staffed with an interim dean for the Spring 2014 semester and a permanent candidate will be selected no later than July 1, 2014.

#### *Planning and Decision Making Manual*

The College has completed a first draft of its *Planning and Decision Making Manual*. The draft will be distributed to the college community and will be reviewed and approved by each college constituency in the Spring 2014 semester. In particular, the College believes that the *Planning and Decision Making Manual* will address College Recommendation #6 in full.

#### Community Needs Assessment

The District is completing a comprehensive community needs assessment in collaboration with each district College. Assessment of CTE needs is a component of the community needs assessment. The College is using the preliminary findings of CTE needs in the community needs assessment report to assess CTE needs in accordance with College Recommendation #4.

**District Recommendation #1**

*In order to increase effectiveness, the District and Colleges should broadly communicate the modification of the evaluation process for faculty and others directly responsible for student progress, which includes student learning outcomes, and ensure that the process is fully implemented. (III.A.1.c)*

The District completed and implemented a comprehensive modification to its faculty evaluation process which incorporated, among other enhancements, student learning outcomes as an integral part of that evaluation process. Although there have been a number of correspondences to faculty and related constituents regarding the modified evaluation process, the District has not issued an all-inclusive communication to highlight such changes. Accordingly, the District will deliver that announcement to faculty and other interested parties in a timely manner.

**District Recommendation #2**

*In order to improve institutional effectiveness, the Board of Trustees should develop goals for increasing its professional development and orientation of new Trustees. (IV.B.1.f)*

Members of the Board of Trustees have served SMCCCD in their elected capacity ranging from 10 years to 24 years with the average term in excess of 17 years. In addition, three of the Trustees have served several years as elected members of other local school boards or the County Office of Education prior to serving in their current capacity. Throughout that long tenure, each Trustee has attended many conferences and workshops to enhance their knowledge and awareness of a wide variety of academic, fiscal, legislative and governance matters. Only recently, due to the extensive and extended statewide financial exigency, the Board has elected to attend fewer conferences and workshops. Nevertheless, the Board will incorporate in its annual development of Board Goals for 2014-15 a commitment to increase its participation in professional development activities and ensure newly elected Trustees receive orientation training.

The Student Trustee typically attends the bi-annual Statewide Student Senate General Assemblies (Fall and Spring) as well as the Student Leadership Conference hosted by the California Community College Student Affairs Association. Also, all newly elected Student Trustees attend a Student Trustee workshop sponsored by the Community College League of California. Often, Student Trustees attend the National Student Advocacy Conference hosted by the American Student Association of Community Colleges in Washington DC.

**District Recommendation #3**

*In order to improve institutional effectiveness, the District should establish a regular cycle for the evaluation of its services and provide documentation regarding the outcomes of the evaluations. (IV.B.3.b, IV.B.3.g)*

Although the District Office regularly and continuously evaluates its services to the Colleges and documents its findings to improve such services, it will begin evaluating its service to the Colleges on a formal six year interval – in conjunction with the six year accreditation cycle – to enhance institutional effectiveness.
