We have received notification from the ACCJC that our *Follow-Up Report* has been accepted and that we have met the recommendations regarding student learning outcomes and assessment in full. Our next required report will be the mid-term report, which is due in October 2016. I would like to share an excerpt from the Team Report:

*Conclusion*: The visiting team, after a review of documentation and interviews with college faculty and staff, considers the work accomplished by the College of San Mateo to address the identification, assessment, and best practices related to student learning outcomes and the evaluation of Student Support Centers, to be extraordinary. The College is encouraged to continue the implementation of assessments and the pursuit of professional development activities toward the analyses of outcomes trends. The visiting team has found that the College of San Mateo has fully addressed the Recommendation, resolved the deficiencies noted by the previous team, and now meets Standards.

Most importantly, I want to thank our deans and all of you. I know that you are on the "front lines" and that you must juggle many priorities. You all stepped up to help the College complete the work necessary to meet this accreditation recommendation.
