3.1	Credit for Prior Learning	Beck/ McVean	10	<p>Update on the credit for prior learning</p> <p>This update is in response to legislation passed in 2020 (Title V, 55050), which provided assessment opportunities for military transcripts, industry recognized credentials, and portfolio review (in addition to the already established standardized tests, like AP, and Credit by Exam).</p> <p>New regulations directed that every district will adopt and publish CPL policies and affirmed that discipline faculty assess applications. For students, Title 5 dictates that their transcripts are annotated to reflect that credit was earned by assessment of prior learning and that district policies allow students to accept, declines, or appeal decisions.</p> <p>CSU has updated their CPL policy (EO 1036), which requires CSU campuses to allow CPL credit for “pass-along.” UCs are excepted.</p> <p>Marianne shared that CPL has positive outcomes for students. For example, students who earn CPL accumulate more credits through coursework, they save time to degree completion (6-10 months quicker), and they are twice as likely to complete a degree.</p> <p>Next time Marianne visits, she will share information about articulation and student evaluation.</p> <p># of SMCCCD students eligible for military credit (JSTs) is 359, but only 28 CPL petitions have been submitted Feb. 2020 to Jan 2022, so there is a lot of opportunity for students to take advantage of this new policy.</p> <p>The CPL work group needs faculty to help plan rollout of new procedures, including workshops and coaching.</p>	Information
