The new FMC provides the Skyline Facilities Team with much needed and improved space and a working environment to effectively carry out their duties. This 14,400 GSF complex was funded by both State and local Bond dollars. The FMC houses shops for electrical, mechanical, carpentry, plumbing, and vehicle maintenance. It provides ample storage areas for the custodial and grounds supplies and equipment. The facility also comes with locker rooms and showers,

CSM Facilities Saves Cash with Trash

The College of San Mateo Facilities team reduced its waste costs from \$81,984 in 2008 to \$44,482 in 2009 – nearly 50% in 2009. While the demolition of Student Services Building 5 contributed to the reduction of campus generated waste, the con-

certed efforts of CSM Facilities Department staff also factored greatly to the reduction in costs. Changes in the sizes and numbers of dumpsters on campus and adjustments to the frequency levels on the exchange schedule helped to dramatically cut back on the number of visits that the waste hauler needed to make to campus. Further, CSM Facilities Department staff made a

more concerted effort to ensure that access to the corporate yard was minimized by non-Facilities personnel by securing the gate during operating hours. As a result, the amount of noncampus generated waste dumping was mini-

mized. Once Building 10's construction is completed in the Spring of 2011, there will be a new 30 yard trash compactor which will further assist to keep waste costs down.

Skyline Facilities Supports Campus Smoking Policy

Skyline College is committed to providing its students, faculty, staff, guests, and children in the Child Development Center with a safe and healthy environment. Based on this commitment, Skyline College implemented a new smoking policy at the beginning of the Fall Semester. Smoking is now only permitted in parking lots and in designated areas on the periphery around main campus. The Skyline Facilities groundskeepers did a magnificent job with supporting the campus by constructing and establishing ten designated smoking areas, posting over

250 signs throughout campus, and painting lines at pedestrian entrances to demarcate the smoke-free main campus.

To that end, all reports have been favorable to date.
